Contribution of three faculty through Board of Studies of University and participation in curriculum design and restructure of university syllabus provide the right impetus and direction for enriching the curricular aspects of our institution. In 2019 - 20, our 02 faculties are working on Board of Studies of parent university and contributing the curriculum enrichment. Apart from this, many of faculties attended curriculum related workshops / seminars which helped them to get updated with new areas and trends in curriculum. The institution has the formal system of curriculum delivery and implementation in a planned and coordinated manner involving the faculties of the college. The respective departments, The timetable and infrastructure committees coordinate to meet the infrastructural requirements. Books and reading materials are made available to the students through central library. Students are also exposed to practical experiences through educational tours, excursions and field projects.
